



## **ON STAGE - Empowering young migrants by employability skills through BIOGRAPHIC WORK and elements of DRAMA**

Due to the worsening situation in European countries of young first and second generation migrants being unemployed and showing high drop-out rates in higher and further education, the **ON STAGE project** aims at empowering young migrants by improving their employability skills through biographic work and elements of drama.

The **ON STAGE project partners from Austria, Greece, Norway, Portugal and Spain** are developing didactic materials for VET providers and their staff who are working with first or second generation migrants to use during the preparation to enter into the construction, health-care, retail, tourism or transportation/storage sector.

After a **successful transfer phase** of the two innovative European products - BRIDGE and WRITING THEATRE - the partnership **developed three essential didactic tools** to equip trainers and counsellors with the ON STAGE approach and methodology; these are: the **ON STAGE Handbook**, the **ON STAGE Practice Set** and the **ON STAGE ECVET Kit**. During the second year, the **testing and validation** of those didactic tools will be conducted. All the **ON STAGE partners** are very happy to have the opportunity for engaging the **local educators who work with young migrants** and may be available for inputs to the finalisation of the project products.
